DIRECTIONS:

From Kansas City/Lawrence: Take I-70 West to Rice Road (exit 365). At the traffic circle, take the 1st exit onto SE Rice Road. At the next traffic circle, take the 3rd exit onto SE Cyprus Drive. Turn right onto SE Croco Road. Turn right onto SE East Edge Road. Slight right at the 2nd SE Tinman Circle.

From Wichita/Emporia: Take I-335 North/Kansas Turnpike to Topeka. Take exit 177 to merge onto I-470 West toward US-75/Topeka/Salina/S Topeka Blvd. Take exit 6 for Topeka Blvd. Turn right onto SW Topeka Blvd. Turn left onto SE 45th Street. Turn left onto SE Croco Road. Turn left onto SE East Edge Road. Slight right at the 2nd SE Tinman Circle.

From Manhattan/Salina: Take I-70 East through Topeka to Rice Road (exit 365). At the traffic circle, take the 2nd exit onto SE Cyprus Drive. Turn right onto SE Croco Road. Turn right onto SE East Edge Road. Slight right at the 2nd SE Tinman Circle.

From Lincoln/Omaha, NE: Take US-75 South to Topeka. Merge left onto I-70 East through Topeka to Rice Road (exit 365). At the traffic circle, take the 2nd exit onto SE Cyprus Drive. Turn right onto SE Croco Road. Turn right onto SE East Edge Road. Slight right at the 2nd SE Tinman Circle.

From Ramada Convention Center: Go west on SE 6th Avenue. Turn left onto SE Monroe Street. Take the ramp on the left onto I-70 East. Take I-70 East to Rice Road (exit 365). At the traffic circle, take the 2nd exit onto SE Cyprus Drive. Turn right onto SE Croco Road. Turn right onto SE East Edge Road. Slight right at the 2nd SE Tinman Circle.

MIKE ZITO AND HIS BIG BLUES BAND

Mike Zito is one of the most lauded artists in the contemporary blues arena today and rightfully so, but for him, the thing that counts the most is maintaining his honesty, authenticity and integrity. Those are the qualities that have steered Zito's career since the beginning and continue to define every effort he's offered since. Zito has won Blues Music Awards for Song of the Year and Rock Blues Artist of the Year and was a founding member of Royal Southern Brotherhood.



INDIGENOUS

Born and raised on the Yankton Sioux Reservation in South Dakota, Mato Nanji has fronted Indigenous since he was a teenager in the 1990s. His powerful riffs and incendiary solos are reminiscent of Carlos Santana and Jimi Hendrix. The band has achieved several Billboard charting albums while thrilling crowds with their high energy live shows.



JEREMIAH JOHNSON BAND

Born and raised in St. Louis, Jeremiah Johnson is the voice of Mississippi River blues blending with the struggles of everyday life. He reached the semi-finals of the International Blues Challenge in 2011 and is featured regularly on Sirius XM's B.B. King's Bluesville show. After signing with Ruf Records in 2018, Johnson continues to create emotionally charged Southern blues rock powered by the common man's passion for life and all the struggles in between.
